# What Sparked DBLN?

On July 22, 2024, 4 days before the anniversary of the 34th Americans with Disabilities Act, an unspoken but clear promise was broken. In 2014, the DeafBlind community had high hopes a DeafBlind Executive Director of the Helen Keller National Center (HKNC) would be chosen. Hopes were dashed. The Board felt the top gualified DeafBlind candidate, Christopher Woodfill, was not ready. So, an Associate Executive Director (AED) position was created to eventually elevate him into the Executive Director position "next time" (source links: HKS press release 2014; Bryen M. Yunashko's Letter). The "next time" came in 2021. A non-DeafBlind HKNC personnel, Deborah Harlin, was promoted into the Executive Director position (source link: HKS press release). The "next time" came again in 2024 and a non-DeafBlind Executive Director, John Filek, was selected, yet again (source link: HKS press release 2024). HKNC, the only national comprehensive vocational rehabilitation training center for deafblind youths and adults, comprises of roughly 7% DeafBlind personnel out of over 170 employees with a 5% DeafBlind Board (only 1 DeafBlind board member). For more than half a century, HKNC has never had a DeafBlind Executive Director. For these reasons, the DeafBlind community mobilized bringing together 262 DeafBlind petitioners, including authors, business owners, community organizers and parents, to sign a historic petition calling for DeafBlind Leadership NOW, inspired and authored by John Lee Clark (JLC). ### **Evolution of DBLN**

Knowing he would be busy pursuing his doctoral studies, JLC tapped a few people to help usher in supporters. Cristina Hartmann and Suzanne "Suzi"

Guimond were the glue that enabled DBLN movement to forge ahead as we slowly began to stand on our own, supported by brilliant minds managing advocacy and legislative outreach, operating the website, moderating the DBLN alliance listserv, fundraising, and administering social media accounts. All hands were on deck working feverishly to launch the website on August 13, 2024 and to usher in supporters in the DBLN alliance listserv. Since then, the DBLN core team structure has been fluid, shifting, and changing. We were aware that JLC was focused on his doctoral studies. Cristina and Suzi graciously provided their temporary periodic recaps and insights with their hands on the ground for political rumblings and premonitions. The November presidential elections kept us occupied as we braced ourselves for our uncertain futures. As the holidays approached, we embraced our loved ones, both human and furry.

#### **DBLN Core Team**

As some of you may already have come across in the listserv updates or social media outlets, Marc Safman is DBLN's advocacy/legislative outreach point of contact, Theresa Wells is DBLN's web mistress, and Vicky Magliocchino is DBLN's fundraiser. We also have a DBLN admin who synthesizes and edits information to update across all platforms including DBLN's listserv, blog, and social media accounts. We are all volunteers. Hence, we will eventually need someone to take over social media accounts. For years non-Deaf people have tried to produce this documentary but the Deaf community held firm that Deaf people should lead the production of this documentary as their ancestors did at DPN.
